NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CENTER POINT, that the maximum property tax dollars for the affected tax levies for Fiscal Year 2021 shall not exceed \$989,807, which represents an increase of greater than 102% from the maximum property tax dollars requested for FY2020.

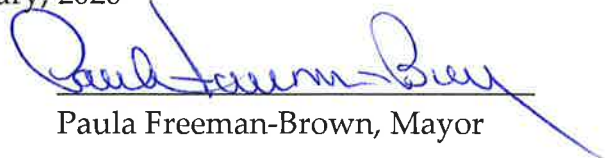

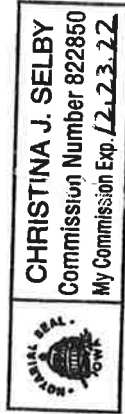

BOARD REPORTS - Department Heads: Nick Woodruff, Activities Director, spoke about 2019-2020 student participation in activities and athletics. His goal is to increase participation and plan for the future based on trends in participation. Mr. Woodruff discussed policies he is working on in the activities department, including the 24-hour rule and sign-out sheets for students leaving events with parents. Mr. Woodruff has started a twitter for Alburnett sports, looking on a signing day for seniors on February 5, and filling open coaching positions. health Fridays and the different skill development that they are working on in middle school to prepare them for high school physical education. Overall as a department, they have been using their collaborative team time to align the department and show progression of activities, as students get older.

CITY OF CENTRAL CITY BUDGET WORKSHOP MEETING JANUARY 16, 2020

Mayor Griggs called the workshop meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Council members Arthur, Levenhagen, and Whitson answered roll call. Also present was Public Works Director Ebon and City Administrator/Clerk Annis. Motion Whitson, 2nd Levenhagen to approve the agenda - all aye. Councilmember O'Leary joined the meeting at 8:02 p.m.

Eagle Point Solar representatives presented proposals for installing solar panels at the Washwater Treatment Plant and the Falcon Civic Center. Public Works Director Ebon made a request for an increase in his salary from \$26.46 per hour to \$30.00 per hour with a \$1.25 increase each year. He teaches \$35.00 per hour and then annual increases based on cost-of-living plus annual increases. Council will budget a 14% increase for Ebon for FY21.

Public Works Director Ebon presented a list of wants and needs to be considered in the FY21 budget. Annis will place items into the budget for Council's consideration to keep or cut based on Fund Balances. Administrator Annis reviewed FY21 revenues line by line with the following for each revenue line:

General Fund \$907,087, Road Use Tax Fund (RUT) \$170,500, Employee Benefits Fund \$37,755 (this will change based on discussed wage increase) Tax Incremental Finance (TIF) Fund \$305,755, Debt Service Fund \$195,557, Trust Funds \$2,400, Capital Projects Fund \$200,000, Water Fund \$200,000, Sewer Fund \$200,000, Sewer Capital Fund \$35,000, Sewer Sinking Fund \$159,810, Daycare Fund \$43,000, Total FY21 Revenues \$2,720,333.

Council reviewed the Engineer's cost estimate of \$985,175 for a 4th Street S Improvement Project. Council discussed completion and bonding for the project in FY21 and amending the debt with LOST funds. Administrator Annis reviewed FY21 expenses line by line with the following for each fund:

General Fund \$908,470, Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) Fund \$136,600, Road Use Tax Fund (RUT) \$150,539, Employee Benefits Fund \$75,309, Tax Incremental Finance (TIF) Fund \$203,255, Debt Service Fund \$330,578, Trust Funds \$5,000, Capital Projects Fund \$1,286,000, Water Fund \$185,269, Water Deposit Fund \$2,000, Sewer Capital Fund \$35,000, Sewer Fund \$240,818, Sewer Capital Fund \$179,590, Sewer Sinking Fund \$159,180, Daycare Fund \$42,000, Total FY21 Expenses \$3,877,428.
